Zoia Skoropadenko Art STATEMENT


Take Attic art and ideas and re-create them in a new way to technique. That is what I do in my TORSO series.

Using classical torsos as an inspiration I re-create them using the flesh of octopuses and contemporary technic - acrylic with mixed media. I capture the result like I do in my still lives.

Not satisfies with what is going on in contemporary art and tired of decomposing garbage with long meaningless explanations masquerading as an art, I decided to create something that would be intriguing yet accessible. That why new would reflect the ancient Greek ideas of beauty and the search for its perfection.


Like artists from Renaissance times, I reach back to emulate the beauty of Attic Art, to reconsider and recreate it in a modern way with the modern medium.

Today I work on new TORSOs that will include TORSOs inspired by work of old masters, impressionists, modern art. Special accent on TORSOs by Leonardo da Vinci and August Roden.



TORSO Acrylic on canvas/Mixed technique 180x120cm




TORSO Acrylic on canvas/Mixed technique 180x120cm




TORSO Acrylic on canvas/Mixed technique 160x120cm




TORSO Acrylic on canvas 120x90cm




TORSO Acrylic on canvas 160x120cm







Zoia Skoropadenko Studio | BIO

Zoia Skoropadenko is **Monaco** based **contemporary mixed-media artist**. She is the creator and owner of **micro-gallery La Vitrine** - an **alternative contemporary art space** for **emerging artistic talent**.

Born in Ukraine she was tutored by Ukrainian National Artist Grigory Sinitsa. She then entered the National Art School, Art College and studied in Institute of Fine Arts. She continued her education in Lviv National University. After a long adventure "down and out" ended up in Monaco. Skoropadenko found herself working in the art scene and at the same time supporting herself translating for yacht companies and Interpol.

She participated in the artistic life of the French Riviera. Along the way she met such prominent contemporary artists as Arman, Ernst Fuchs, Sosno and Robert Rauschenberg. Became a member of National Art Committee, illustrated a book and exhibited. She worked in the Mosaic Art Studio of Nall Hollis.

In 2011 Skoropadenko curated an exhibition of Ukrainian Impressionists in European Parliament in Strasbourg.

One of her biggest solo controversial exhibitions of TORSO was held in Council of Europe under Ukrainian flag.

In November 2014 her work from series "Green" and "Intellectual landscapes" was auctioned in Los Angeles at the Auction of Michael Hort Foundation on request of renown art collector Stanley Hollander.


In November 2013 Skoropadenko was invited to speak about being a successful female artist immigrant in European Commission in Brussels. In November 2016 Zoia inaugurated her sculpture 'The Hope' in Soma city in Fukushima Prefecture.

In 2011 the Monaco government granted Skoropadenko the official status of a Professional Artist-Painter of Monaco.

Zoia splits her time mainly between Monaco, Japan, the US, Belgium, UK and France where she exhibits frequently.


Her widely exhibited TORSO series is considered her most controversial work as noted in publications such as the Brussels Times and Culture Box.








TORSO SOLO EXHIBITION Shooting Range of London Stock Exchange London Bridge LONDON 2015




